Nativity Plays Advance Notice

Dear parents/carers,

Please note that for a number of reasons, which include health and safety due to our ever increasing numbers meaning less tickets per family each year and the tiredness of young children coming back to school for very late evenings at the end of term, we have decided to change how our traditional nativity plays are held this year.

Rest assured, our infant nativity plays are still going ahead for all three classes. However, each infant class will now hold its own age appropriate nativity at 4pm in the week beginning 11th December. This means we will have increased capacity so grandparents can attend as well as parents and siblings and the young children in each class will only be in school for one evening and only until about 4:30/4:40pm.

Parlick (Reception) Class Nativity will be 4pm on Monday 11th December.

Fairsnape (Year 1) Class Nativity will be 4pm on Wednesday 13th December.

Pendle (Year 2) Class Nativity will be 4pm on Thursday 14th December.

The children in each class will be kept here and changed into their costumes on their allocated night by school staff. Parents and grandparents can collect any siblings (if need be) at our usual finish time of 3:30pm on the infant playground and then go straight to the school hall to watch the performance start at 4pm. No tickets will be required. Each performance will finish by 430pm so children can then be quickly changed and then collected from the corridor outside their classroom.

We are notifying parents now as we understand these changes may mean some working parents may need to book time off to finish work early to be here for 4pm.


